Martin's Message

Eastertide: the 'Great Fifty Days'

As Christians we are an 'Easter people', and our celebrations of the Resurrection of our Lord extend over fifty days. They reach their climax at **Pentecost**, 'the birthday of the Church' (9th June this year). To mark this occasion there will be a **United Benefice Choral Evensong** at St Edmund's, Marske at 6:30pm. I look forward to seeing you there.

Meanwhile, the fortieth day of Eastertide, **Ascension Day**, will fall on Thursday, 30th May. This is when we recall the conclusion of Christ's resurrection appearances and his return to heaven – and his promise to send the gift of the Holy Spirit to fill us with his risen life. We will mark this special occasion with a service of **Holy Communion** at 7pm. Do please join us.

The Sunday before Ascension Day is known as **Rogation Sunday** (26th May). Traditionally, in the lead-up to Ascension Day God's blessing on the newly-sown crops would be sought. Nowadays, we extend this to asking for God's blessing on human labour – that it may be fruitful in securing the welfare of individuals, families and communities, and the safeguarding of the environment. This will be the theme of the **Meet Service** at 10am, when we have the privilege of hosting the church service as part of the 127th Richmond Meet. Please be part of this occasion when the whole community will gather and receive God's blessing.

Farewell to our Ordinand Sian

As she prepares for her ordination on 29th June Sian's last Sunday with us will be 26th May. She has truly been a blessing to us whilst she has been with us, and we will miss her presence amongst us. We wish her well in the next stage of her ministry as Assistant Curate in Masham. The barbecue at the Rectory on 18th May (please see details elsewhere, under **Benefice Stroll/Drive/Cycle**) will be a lovely social occasion on which to say farewell.

Thy Kingdom Come

For the ten days between Ascension Day and Pentecost we are invited to join in the wave of prayer known as *Thy Kingdom Come*. At the heart of our prayers will be the words Jesus himself taught us, '*Thy kingdom come*, thy will be done'.

This is when Christians back up that petition in the Lord's Prayer with missionary action – from solidarity in prayer to helping others learn how to pray, from the witness of prayer walks or participating in Christian Aid Week to other forms of Christian witness all year round.



The Archbishops of Canterbury and York remind us: 'As we pray *Thy Kingdom Come* we should expect that God will use us to help answer our prayer. He will give us opportunities to witness to him with the people we have been praying for. He will use us to invite people to know and experience the goodness of his Kingdom and to join his family.'

Claire Murray, Jonathan Roberts, and Susan Welch are our elected **Deanery Synod** representatives, with one year remaining of their three-year term.

We are grateful to each of them for their willingness to serve in the governance of our church. **Do please hold them in your prayers** – particularly, as they gather for a **PCC Away Day** on 11th May. This is when the PCC will consider the strategy needed to realise our new **Vision for St Mary's** parish church: to be a people and a place where love works.

The next one of these (on May 12th at 6.30pm) will be a very joyful and special service held jointly with other choirs and singers affiliated to the Royal School of Church Music. A celebration of Easter, it will include the beautiful anthem 'The angel rolled the stone away', by Gordon Appleton - a man well-known to many of us at St Mary's and who died suddenly on Easter Day last year. Other music will include works by Herbert Brewer, Charles Wood and local composer Philip Wilby. As usual, Andrew Christer will be providing stylish accompaniments on the organ and we will be under the baton of Andrew Robinson, an experienced and inspirational conductor and former Regional Music Advisor for the RSCM.

The following Saturday (18th May) sees one of the most accomplished chamber choirs in north Yorkshire pay their first visit to the church. The Paulinus Singers is a choir based in Ripon with a wide and varied repertoire encompassing top- notch performances of unaccompanied choral works and songs. Yours Truly may also be permitted to blow some cobwebs out of the organ in a couple of pieces at this concert which starts at 7.30pm.

Pentecost Sunday this year is on 9th June which falls conveniently on the second Sunday and therefore Choral Evensong week. This year we are going to celebrate that Church Feast by singing Evensong in the beautiful location of Marske church - please do join us for a relaxed service in a splendid Dales setting. 14th July will see us back at St Mary's for a big end-of-term service of Choral Evensong. There will be no service in August BUT the really exciting news is that we will be celebrating our Patronal Festival on September 8th not just at the morning service but also at a special choral evensong combined (at St Mary's) with the choir of Bradford Cathedral! Music will include Noble's stylish setting of the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis in b minor and other music appropriate for St Mary's Day.

Also in the pipeline is another visit to Ripon Cathedral to sing there and a workshop and concert with the phenomenal Barnsley Youth Choir, who sang here on their way to performing at the 2018 Edinburgh Festival


