Letter from Bishop John

December 2017 and January 2018

I was following a little gaggle of diminutive school children as they trotted along a street in London. They held hands in pairs and chatted excitedly to each other as they padded along Vauxhall Bridge Road going I've no idea where. But I was enchanted and couldn't help but smile with pleasure at their innocence and sheer enthusiasm for life, wherever it led. Small children seem incapable of walking in what to an adult is an orderly manner – they have to run, skip, hop or go backwards. Children wander about church supremely confident in their own autonomy and look inquisitively at adults who have for some reason been locked up in pews. They're wonderfully 'themselves'.

There's something captivating about miniatures, isn't there? Whether its miniature people or my various collections of miniature sheep, cricketers and clergy, miniatures are endearing. Miniature people have all the features of the adult version but writ small and utterly charming. They copy adults as best they can and we delight in their brave attempts to butter a piece of bread or put the top on a bottle.

It's not surprising that the baby of Bethlehem is popular at Christmas. He has all the diminutive features we love, the vulnerability, the innocence, the miracle of life in a tiny package. It's Jesus' birthday and we're all invited to his party. The sadness is that only a minority of those at the party will notice that Jesus is there. On the other hand, he won't mind. He's not small minded.

In first century terms, Jesus knew how to party. He was always seen at dinner parties and celebrations, so much so that his enemies pointed at his partying life-style as an example of his unfitness for office as messiah.

But Christians believe that here at Christmas we have God in miniature. This is God in a form we can manage – a human life. This is *God, the Autobiography*. And at St Mary's and tens of thousands of churches all over the country, we'll be inviting everyone to his party this Christmas, to marvel at the baby God.

There's just one catch. He grew up.

If we try to keep Jesus in the straw, innocent and innocuous, we'll miss the whole point. Jesus the Miniature, grew up into Jesus the Game-Changer. He came to change the course of history, and that's what he's doing right now, all over the world, as the party rolls on.

Do come.

Epiphany

On 6 January Epiphany is celebrated world wide - the visit of the wise men to the baby Jesus. But who were these wise men? No one knows for sure. Matthew calls them 'Magi', and that was the name of an ancient caste of a priestly kind from Persia. It wasn't until the third century that they were called kings - by a church father, Tertullian.

Another church father, Origin, assumed there were three - to correspond with the gifts given. Later Christian interpretation came to understand gold as a symbol of wisdom and wealth, incense as a symbol of worship and sacrifice, and myrrh as a symbol of healing - and even embalming. Certainly Jesus challenged and set aright the way in which the world handled all three of these things. Since the eighth century, the magi have had the names Balthasar, Caspar and Melchior.

By the time you read this we will have celebrated Christingle at the end of November at Fun-Key Church.


Fun-Key Church and St Marys Church now share Christingle which means double the fun!

Engaging the Word - biblical literacy and Christian discipleship

By Peter M. Phillips, BRF, £7.99 - 'The Bible talks of itself not as a rule book,' writes Phillips, 'nor as an instruction manual for life but as the implanted Word, the engine of the Christian life, the driving force for Christian discipleship.' In this thoughtful and wide-ranging analysis of the meaning of biblical literacy from Augustine through Erasmus to Wesley and on into the digital world, Phillips demonstrates the individual, corporate and cultural aspects of biblical engagement. He develops a passionate case for that engagement to be resourced and deepened so that our faith is strengthened. 'The Church in the West has a kind of eating disorder,' the author explains. 'The church is not "eating the book"; it's not meditating on the Word. As a result, Jesus' disciples are spiritually malnourished and failing to
