

Farewell from the Rectory

In 2010 I was appointed to the benefice of Richmond with Hudswell, Downholme and Marske and Liz and I moved up from Nottingham in the early November. The easiest way to describe our start is to quote from my letter sent to my previous parishes.

"We are now in Richmond, but can only describe our first few weeks as memorable!!

Record breaking snow showers and arctic temperatures have made life interesting. Just to make our start even more memorable, the brand new heating system developed a leak and had to be turned off, on the night when temperatures reached -15°! The plumber thought it was because the filter had been damaged by frost – which is inside our utility room!!"

Such a lot has happened since that cold winter and it is a joy to see how so much has grown and developed in the life of our parish.

When I applied for this post, part of the information I received was the parish profile. This contained a full picture of Richmond, Hudswell, Downholme and Marske together with the life of the churches. It also contained "Strengths and Weaknesses, a list of "Requirements of a new Minister" and "Key challenges for the new Incumbent"! It is for you to decide how I have measured up to those daunting tasks. However I believe that in many ways much of these tasks and challenges have been met.

The key thing for me and a source of much joy as I reflect on my ministry here is to see the way in which God is working in so many people as he moves his church onward and outward.

In St Mary's, whilst maintaining much of the tradition of the church in terms of churchmanship and worship styles, we together have managed to introduce a wider worship pattern for all ages. To have an established pattern of worship which includes BCP Holy Communion, Sung Eucharist, Choral Evensong, Cafe Church, Fun – Key Church, Free to Be and two mid week services of traditional language Holy Communion illustrates the commitment so many of you have for making worship welcoming and inclusive for all.

In St Michael's & All Saints Downholme and St Edmunds Marske the comments in the visitors books speak for themselves. Comments are made re the sense of being in a loved building with a welcoming atmosphere. These two loved churches are supported in such a lovely way. Much is said about the difficulties of rural ministry, but I often hold Downholme and Marske up as two wonderful examples of church in the community. For example just ask those on the coast to coast walk who so appreciate the drinks and snacks laid out for them in St Edmunds, with a simple honesty box for donations.

Whilst it has been very sad to witness the forthcoming closure of St Michael and All Angels Hudswell, it has also been lovely to see how those from Hudswell have so easily become part of St Michael's church family in Downholme.

Thank you for your faith, your love and your eagerness in so many different ways, to proclaim that Jesus Christ is alive and relevant in our world today.

The ministry in this benefice has been enabled and strengthened by our ministry team, who work together so well. I would like to give a personal thank you to all the

Readers and retired clergy for their support. The mixture of energy and experience, underpinned by a humble and hard working practical faith has been a delight to experience. Combining this with the incredibly hard work of the officers and members of the two PCCs has enabled the churches to be church in every sense of the word.

It is so important to enable church in the community and the close working links with our schools, local councils, civic and military organisations is practical and actual and has been a powerful form of Christian outreach. You have played and continue to play a vital role in these areas of God's work in the community and I thank you so much.

So many of you, too many to name, have been particularly responsible for the expanding outreach of the churches in the Benefice. I wish you every blessing as you continue to discern God's will for you as individuals and as church.

On a personal note Liz and I will be leaving you all with mixed feelings. A sense of sadness at leaving a family in which we have felt so much a part, mixed with a sense of excitement as we look forward to our retirement back in Nottinghamshire.

Thank you so much!

We hope you will be able to come to our farewell Songs of Praise at 6.30pm on Sunday, July 9th, in St Mary's, followed by refreshments.

We will also be holding an open house at the Rectory on Saturday July 15th, from 10:00am – 5:00pm, to which you are all warmly welcome.

As a result they have formed a group called "The Happy Bodgers". Happily they are far more skilled than their title suggests and they are able to offer a variety of help free of charge.



They write -

"We realise that, as people grow older or disabled, they may need help with odd jobs. They may be perfectly capable of changing a light bulb, but can't safely climb onto a chair to do it. Or climb into the loft to retrieve stored items. So we offer to do such simple tasks on a voluntary basis provided they are within our own abilities. These are DIY jobs which may require simple skills, not the sorts of job that would need a 'white van man'. We have different skill sets and could allocate tasks accordingly.

We could operate in pairs if necessary, eg to move heavy furniture in order to clean. We might be able to help with some joinery, simple repairs, electric fittings, small jobs in the garden, minor computer problems and advice on using software, internet, email etc. We might be able to clear gutters and take things to the dump. Try us - we can say no if we don't feel capable.

We could probably not take on regular tasks such as lawn mowing, weeding, shopping etc.

One of his managers recently commented: "I really respect that you always tell the truth and don't try to hide problems – that's had a huge impact on me, and on the team too."

All of us can approach our work in a way that gives off a Christ-like aroma. The scent comes from the ripening fruits of the Spirit in our lives: love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.
