Since he was small, Troy has been obsessed with anything with wheels, scooters, skate boards ect and lately has been showing some real skill in gravity sports.

During the snow at winter, he was able to stand up on a sledge and ride down hills, with no fear. So I decided to start taking him along to long board and street luge events.

At these events, riders free ride and race down hill at top speeds sometimes 50mph!

This weekend we took him to a British Championship event called Tregaron in Wales. After making lots of friends with the older riders and getting lots of advice, Troy was allowed to ride and race, testing out a prototype of a street sledge.

Troy took part in 2 races against adults on street luge, and managed to get a 5th and a 4th place!

As he really became part of the community, the organisers allowed him to take on the responsibility of "last rider". This is the person responsible for making sure the road is clear and ready to ride again after all the riders have been down. He took this very seriously as it isn't normally given to some one who isn't an adult!

During the awards ceremony, Troy was awarded a top quality long board, that all the riders clubbed together to get for him. They said he had really earned it by showing grit, determination and speed! With lots of practice Troy will be able to compete on stand up long board with the adults, so watch this space.
