We have had guite a few visitors in school this week. Our Reception children have now officially moved into their new classroom. They are thoroughly enjoying learning in their new base and gorgeous outdoor area. After half term, please could Reception children use the Key Stage 1 door to come into school and be collected from this door too.

Our Year 1 and 2 children have been continuing their Pirate topic. This week they have been learning traditional sea shanties and playing instruments too. Also, as part of their maths work, Year 2 visited the Prestige Car Garage. They had an amazing afternoon!

Our incredible inventors in Year 3 and 4 have been working hard writing instructions and also solving problems about fractions. It is great to see so many children really challenging themselves with our 'Green to make you steam' questions.

Years 5 and 6 have both been writing stories based on the narrative poem 'the Highwayman'. I have been thoroughly impressed by their wonderful use of vocabulary. This week all of the children have been thinking about Internet Safety day too. It is so important that we teach our children to keep themselves safe online – Do ask them what they have learnt.

One of the highlights of my week was working with all of the children, from Nursery to Year 6, on Thursday afternoon. As we now have our new name, the children have been designing new logos and uniform for school. They had some great ideas and I look forward to seeing the finished designs.

In other news, on Thursday Miss Hodges and Mr McCulloch went to visit a school in London because after half term we will be taking part in a project called 'ReflectED'. It is an approach to learning that teaches and develops children's metacognition skills (learning how they learn). We are really looking forward to using this new approach to support and improve attainment!

Looking forward to after half term, we will be learning about Chinese New Year on the first day back, with all classes taking part in exciting activities. Also on Tuesday 20th February, we have our first after school cookery session for parents.

As you know, I work for our school for 50% of the week and share my time between school sites, so am not always available. Do remember that our Associate Headteacher, Miss Hodges is now Head of School and can be contacted on a daily basis if necessary.




Year 6 Build Suspension Bridges
