Ordinary Time 8th Sunday after Trinity

'Ordinary' refers to the periods of the Church Year falling outside of the major festival seasons which precede and follow Christmas and Easter.

The theme of the readings for the 8th Sunday after Trinity centres on spiritual vigilance, divine providence, and bearing good fruit. It explores trusting in God's daily provision, standing firm against false teachings, and staying alert for Christ's return.
