and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Galatians (Galatians 4.4-7).

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke (Luke 1:46-55).

⁴⁸ for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant.

⁵⁰ His mercy is for those who fear him
 from generation to generation.
⁵¹ He has shown strength with his arm;
 he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.

⁵² He has brought down the powerful from their thrones,

⁵³ he has filled the hungry with good things,
and sent the rich away empty.

⁵⁴ He has helped his servant Israel,

The Eucharistic Prayer

We give you thanks and praise for your Son,
