Weekly Prayer Meeting: Tuesday evenings, 7.30-9:00pm

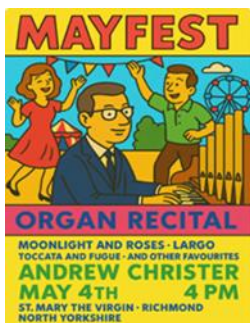
All are welcome to the Tuesday Prayer Meeting. We start with a short relaxed bible study then move into a time of prayer.
