Ordinary Time

This refers to the periods of the Church Year falling outside the major festival seasons which precede and follow Christmas and Easter. "Ordinary" is derived from *ordinal*, meaning counted. During these weeks, the Church does not focus on an event in Jesus's life, instead exploring his broader ministry, teachings, and everyday discipleship. This gives us time to explore the scriptures in detail.
